# WELCOME MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

Dignity should never be a luxury. Yet for many young women and girls in our communities, the lack of safety, healthcare, education, and even basic necessities can stand between them and the future they deserve.

When we began Rescue Women Foundation, we believed a simple truth: when a woman is given dignity, safety, and opportunity, an entire generation begins to rise.

In 2025, because of your kindness, we saw this truth come to life again and again. This year we welcomed 106 babies, provided shelter and care for vulnerable teenage mothers, and supported 116 mothers and children in school. In a country where maternal mortality remains a serious challenge, we are especially grateful that not a single mother was lost at our shelter this year.

This year, we also stepped beyond our walls—hosting our first March for Life, providing self-defense training for girls, and traveling to remote villages, slums, and island communities to distribute reusable sanitary pads, mama kits, and shoes. Something as simple as a sanitary pad can determine whether a girl attends school or stays home in shame. Every act of dignity matters. We also celebrated a major milestone when we moved into a larger, secure home that now shelters mothers and babies together and provides space for education, training, and future programs.

None of this would be possible without you. Your generosity restores hope to young mothers, protects vulnerable children, and reminds every girl we serve that she is seen, valued, and worthy of a future.

When you give, you are doing more than meeting a need. You are reminding a young mother that she is not forgotten. You are telling a girl that her future is still worth fighting for.

From the bottom of my heart, thank you for walking this journey with us. I invite you to continue this mission with us. Whether through a donation, sponsoring a mother or child's education, or sharing our story with others, your support helps transform lives and empower communities.

- Safe shelter and maternal care

In addition, we extend care and support to elderly women facing hardship, ensuring dignity at every stage of life.

# OUR JOURNEY OF IMPACT



Since its founding, **Rescue Women Foundation** has grown from a small act of compassion into a life-saving support system for vulnerable mothers and children across Uganda. Each year has brought new opportunities to expand care, strengthen programs, and reach more families in need.

## **2017 — The Beginning**

Rescue Women Foundation was founded with a simple mission: to protect vulnerable teenage mothers and provide a safe place for them and their babies.

## **2018 — First Shelter & Community Outreach**

The foundation began providing shelter, maternal care, and support services for young mothers facing crisis pregnancies.

## **2020 — Expanding Care**

Programs grew to include education sponsorship, medical support, and stronger community outreach for women and girls.

## **2021 — Building Stability**

The foundation strengthened its rescue and foster care programs, ensuring that more mothers and babies could receive safe housing and support.

## **2022 — Education & Empowerment**

The Individual Sponsorship Program expanded, helping more mothers and children stay in school and pursue brighter futures.

## **2023 — Growing Community Partnerships**

New collaborations increased outreach efforts, allowing the foundation to support women and families beyond the shelter.

## **2024 — Expanding Programs**

Vocational training, healthcare support, and prevention initiatives continued to grow, helping women build sustainable livelihoods.

## **2025 – A Year of Impact**

- 106 babies welcomed
- 116 mothers and children supported in school
- First March for Life community event
- Self-defense training for girls
- Mushroom-growing training for sustainable income
- Outreach to remote villages, slums, and island communities
- A larger shelter secured for mothers and babies



2025 Sources of Support





# LITERACY: THE GREATEST GIFT OF ALL.



*Although the year presented unique challenges, the steadfast support of our friends, sponsors, and crowdfunding community made it possible to extend literacy opportunities to more children in need.*

Education remains one of the most powerful tools we can provide to break the cycle of poverty and create lasting change. This year, we celebrate the incredible milestone of supporting 116 mothers and children in school—a testament to the faithfulness and generosity of our community.

Through a \$20,000 grant secured by our friends Nathan and Anna, we were able to cover a full year of tuition for 30 mothers (at \$450 each) and 19 children (at \$330 each). This funding was instrumental in ensuring that these young women and their children could remain in school without interruption.

We are also deeply grateful for ProLove Ministries, led by Dr. Abby Johnson, for sponsoring six girls. Our dedicated friend and committee member Diane faithfully sponsors four girls, our dear friend and committee member Natalie kindly sponsors three children, our friend Kathy sponsors one mother and three children, and our friend Elizabeth sponsors two mothers and two children.

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: MARCH FOR LIFE

March is the birth month of Rescue Women Foundation Founder, Miriam Nabasirye. During that month we held our very first ***March for Life***—a landmark event aimed at raising awareness about teenage pregnancy and supporting vulnerable women and girls in our community. We had over 39 people in attendance and were able to raise over \$1500 from our wonderful donors to support the event.

In Uganda, the focus tends to be on the girls when speaking about teenage pregnancy and advocating for the protection of women. We were especially proud to involve men and boys in the movement this year. Their engagement is vital in building a society where women and girls are protected, respected, and empowered.

We hope to host this event again in 2026 and for many years to come.

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: SELF-DEFENSE TRAINING



Also in March, we held our very first *self-defense training* for the girls in our care.

This empowering session equipped participants with critical skills and knowledge to protect themselves against domestic violence and sexual assault.

The training not only emphasized physical defense techniques but also encouraged the girls to speak out with confidence and stand against abuse.

These tools are vital in our ongoing efforts to combat teenage pregnancy and promote the safety and well-being of young women in our community.

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: MAMA KIT & SANITARY PAD DISTRIBUTION

As a registered non-governmental organization in Uganda, Rescue Women Foundation is committed not only to serving the students in our care, but also to engaging in meaningful outreach within the broader community. In alignment with government requirements—and our own mission—we conduct at least two community initiatives each year that reflect the work we do.



This past November, we expanded our impact by distributing reusable sanitary pads, mama kits for new mothers, and shoes to children in need. Our team traveled to three underserved locations: the remote village of Masaka, Katwe—Kampala’s largest informal settlement (slum)—and Buwaya Island, a hard-to-reach community with limited access to essential resources.

This outreach was fully funded through fundraisers by our partner **African Rising Initiative (ARI)**. We were also honored to have our brother and ARI Co-Founder Ted Anderson join us on-site, making the experience even more meaningful. It was a powerful and memorable time of connection, dignity, and hope—made possible by supporters like you.

---

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: MUSHROOM GROWING TRAINING

Through the generous sponsorship of African Rising Initiative, our founder, Miriam, and fourteen (14) teenage mothers had the incredible opportunity to attend the ***Third Annual African Rising Mushroom Festival*** in Hoima, Uganda.

During the festival, they participated in presentations from international experts, live training demonstrations, and hands-on workshops focused on mushroom cultivation and entrepreneurship. The experience provided both practical skills and fresh inspiration.



Equipped with valuable knowledge and renewed confidence, the group returned to the shelter ready to launch their own mushroom-growing initiative. This new program is designed to serve as both a sustainable food source and an income-generating opportunity—empowering these young mothers with skills that foster long-term self-reliance and economic stability.

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: SECURE HOUSING FOR THE FUTURE



In December, we faced a significant housing challenge that ultimately became a blessing in disguise. With very short notice, we were asked to vacate one of the homes we had been renting. While the situation was stressful at first, it opened the door to an even greater opportunity.

Through the generous support of African Rising Initiative, we were able to secure a much larger facility—one that can accommodate all of the girls and their babies under one roof. Our young mothers were overjoyed and deeply grateful for this new beginning.

Our prayer now is to one day purchase the property and make it a permanent home for Rescue Women Foundation.

We were honored to have ARI Co-Founder Sarah Potter travel to Uganda to be on-site for the move and ribbon-cutting celebration, joined by her Ugandan relatives.

It was a meaningful and joyful milestone for everyone involved.

This new facility provides not only safe housing for pregnant mothers and their babies, but also space for mothers who have returned to school or are pursuing vocational training. It includes room for our offices, a training center, and future program expansion—all within a secure, walled compound that ensures the safety and protection of our residents.

What began as a challenge has become a foundation for growth, stability, and hope.

# RESCUE SPOTLIGHT: SAVING A FAMILY FROM HUNGER AND CHILD LABOR



Thanks to the compassion and generosity of our supporters, we were able to rescue four vulnerable children from hunger and child labor—offering them safety, stability, and a fresh start.

We were alerted to a heartbreaking situation: an eight-year-old girl had become the sole caregiver for her two young brothers and six-month-old baby sister after their single mother suffered a stroke and was left without proper care. In order to feed her siblings, the young girl worked in neighbors' gardens, while the younger children missed school to care for the baby.

Because of your support, we were able to enroll three of the children in boarding school, provide essential supplies and nutrition, transfer their mother to a better medical facility, and bring the infant under our direct care.

Together, we have restored hope, dignity, and the promise of a brighter future for this family. Thank you for making this possible.

# **SUCCESS STORY: EMERGENCY RESPONSE FOR YOUNG EXPECTANT MOTHER**

We responded to the urgent case of a 14-year-old pregnant orphan who was caring for her 4-year-old brother. After being assaulted while selling maize to raise school fees, she contracted severe malaria that affected her speech.

During our intervention, serious medical concerns were discovered, including a dangerous infection and a low fetal heart rate. Further evaluation confirmed a low-lying placenta requiring a scheduled C-section.

Though our shelter was full, we enrolled her brother in boarding school and placed the young mother in our community foster care program with a caring elderly couple.

Thanks to our generous donors, she received urgent medical treatment, a complete Mama Kit, and essential supplies as she prepares to safely welcome her baby. Your support made this life-saving care possible.

**With your ongoing support, we strive to achieve the following goals for 2026:**

- Sustain comprehensive food, shelter, and healthcare services are services for mothers and babies in our care.
- Strengthen and expand vocational training programs that equip young mothers with practical, income-generating skills.
- Institutionalize annual self-defense training for all mothers and staff to promote safety and empowerment.
- Grow attendance, visibility, and strategic partnerships for our second Annual March for Life.
- Advance modern farming initiatives, including expanded Mushroom-Growing training, to promote sustainability and economic empowerment.
- Launch a community Health Awareness Camp and host the inaugural Your Worth Conference to educate and inspire mothers and local families.
- Introduce a Seasonal Live music event to foster community engagement and celebration.
- Increase tuition sponsorship coverage from 50% to full support for all mothers through expansion of our Individual Sponsorship Program.
- Establish Music Training opportunities to nurture creativity, confidence, and personal development among residents.
- Develop a computer lab to provide digital skills training and improve technological literacy.
- Expand our base of committed monthly supporters to ensure sustainable, predictable funding.
- Secure land for agricultural development and future facility construction to support long-term growth.
