# **Mothers & Babies: Our Impact This Quarter**

## **Pregnant Mothers Supported: 37**

- 26 residing at the shelter
- 11 supported in the community

## **Nursing Mothers: 28**

- 21 at the shelter
- 7 in the community

### **Newborns Welcomed: 29**

- 25 born at the shelter
- 4 born in the community

### **Current Babies at Shelter: 33**

• Includes 8 children of school-going mothers

## March for Life: Our First Step Forward

In a groundbreaking event, *Rescue Women's Foundation* hosted its first-ever March for Life—a bold public stand against teenage pregnancy. This inaugural event was aimed at raising awareness about teenage pregnancy and supporting vulnerable women and girls in our community

Despite rain and logistical challenges, the event was a resounding success.

- Funds Raised: \$1,653
- Event Expenses: \$1,570
- Unmet Needs: Unable to distribute Mama Kits or sanitary pads due to a funding gap (\$4,500 budgeted).

#### **Community Involvement:**

36 participants, including active male involvement Sparked critical conversations and inspired a call to action.

We were especially proud to involve men and boys in the movement. Their engagement is vital in building a society where women and girls are protected, respected, and empowered.

Special thanks to everyone who participated. Your contributions helped spark critical conversations and inspired action.

Our shelter is currently at full capacity. Due to limited space, we are unable to accommodate all the mothers and babies in need. Supporting mothers in the community—especially through foster placements—is significantly more costly and complex.

We are actively seeking resources to expand our shelter facilities and provide safer, more stable care for every\_mother and child.
